The Patient Safety and Quality Improvement Act (PSQIA) protections apply to any licensed healthcare provider throughout the healthcare continuum, including health systems, physicians, nurses, EMS pharmacies, and postacute care providers.


The privilege and confidentiality protections are growing in importance as providers develop innovative ways to improve quality of patient care and implement new care delivery models, such as clinically integrated networks, peer review cooperatives, medical necessity peer review, and peer review for primary care. Existing peer review protections are not sufficient to protect most data sharing outside of the entity.

The PSQIA protections are the only protections that protect new performance tools such as physican scorecards and dashboards, and permit quality data to be shared across the healthcare continuum. AQIPS is dedicated to assisting providers to share confidential quality information to continually improve quality performance.
